What is **Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)?**

ASB is conduct that has caused or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress or is capable of causing housing related nuisance or annoyance to any person.

Examples of ASB:

- Excessive noise
- Rowdy behaviour and drunkenness
- Persistent dog barking /uncontrolled animals
- Throwing things from windows or off balconies
- Dealing or taking drugs
- Criminal damage or behaviour
- Verbal abuse, threats or physical violence
- Intimidation and harassment including stalking and hate crimes
- Known perpetrators of fly tipping.

Examples of what isn't ASB:

- Babies crying
- Cooking odours
- One off parties
- Clash of lifestyles including cultural differences or different working patterns
- Children's play
- Noise caused by the property's design or layout
- Bonfires
- Parking issues
- Personal differences or unfriendly looks/ stares
- Reasonable DIY and other daily
 activities

If you're experiencing ASB, we encourage you to speak to us. We will:

- Agree an action plan and assign an officer to lead on your case
- Investigate your complaint by gathering evidence and keep you updated with our progress
- Consider early intervention such as mediation and acceptable behaviour agreements
- Work with other agencies such as the police to consider preventative measures
- Let you know we've resolved your case and when we'll refer for closure.

What we expect from residents:

- You and anyone else whose behaviour you're responsible for (including children) not to commit ASB, hate incidents or crimes
- You to resolve minor disputes with your neighbours
- Provide evidence to investigate your complaint.
